Brief Introduction of the Institution

B.D.M.M. Girls' Degree College, Shikohabad, was established on 22nd August 1973 with the objective of promoting higher education among women. Since its inception, the college has been offering undergraduate courses in the Arts stream. In July 1986, postgraduate programmes in Hindi and Sanskrit were introduced.

Over time, the institution has expanded its academic offerings to include **M.A. programmes** in Home Science, Psychology, Sociology, Music (Vocal), English, Political Science, Economics Education, History, under the self-financing scheme. Additionally, the college offers a one-year, employment-oriented Diploma in Computer Applications, duly recognized by the University.

All courses, both regular and self-financed are affiliated with and recognized by **Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University** (formerly Agra University). The college is the only women's higher education institution in the city and is administered by the Shikohabad Municipal Council. It is also included under the government grant-in-aid system.

The institution has played a pivotal role in promoting women's education in this relatively underdeveloped region of the state. It actively encourages holistic development through participation in co-curricular and extracurricular activities, including the National Service Scheme (NSS) and other student engagement initiatives.

The college maintains a well-structured academic environment supported by qualified faculty, along with adequate facilities for sports, cultural programmes, and library services. A variety of activities such as exhibitions, debates, quizzes, sports events, and art competitions are organized regularly. Several committees ensure transparency, discipline, and the smooth functioning of academic and administrative processes.
